

UPDATE ON THE NEW PRESS

Two years ago we began looking for a press that would be newer and take us into the future. We continued to look and pray for God to open the door for a press that would fit that need. In October of 2020, we were contacted about a press

that would work for us. We were able to purchase the press for 8% of what it was paid for new in 2007. The number of impressions on the press were equal to what we run in two years. We added up the purchase price of the press, the cost to move it, and the cost of additional equipment we would need to make it work for our purposes, and set a goal of the finances we would need. Praise the Lord, within 40 days the money was available from four major donations! We believe the Church is responsible for taking care of the Bible, and we will continue to do that. Thank you for your support of this ministry, both financially and



prayer-wise. I look forward to sharing what God is doing at *Bearing Precious Seed*, and how the press installation and operation is progressing going forward. Our goal is to have a Dedication Service for the new press Sunday, May 2nd. If you would like to be with us that day, we would love for you to join us.

PAPER-THE GREATEST NEED

What is the greatest need at *Bearing Precious Seed?* The answer is paper. Going forward this will be even more evident than ever. We are in the process of bringing in a newer press that will have six printing units. God has provided in a miraculous way for this to become a reality. The goal in obtaining this press will be to eliminate costly changeovers, both in time and in paper waste. Our current press will remain on John & Romans, and we will print Bibles and New Testaments on the new press. This alone will eliminate between 30 and 40 days of downtime a year just in changeovers. It will also make it possible to bind Bibles in one pass instead of two, so binding will take half of the time that it currently does. Our capacity will increase; therefore, the need for paper will increase. We are excited about the new press coming in, and the goal is to have it running by April 23rd. Over the last 14 years, we have

We have used 196 truckloads during that period of time, which is right at one load per month for Bibles and New Testaments. This amount should increase due to less downtime and the press availability for Bibles and New Testaments. We anticipate seeing how God will provide going forward. The cost of the paper needed for Bibles has increased, but we have not changed our stated goal per roll of paper due to the cost of paper for John & Romans being cheaper. We strive to keep cost as low as possible. We would like to thank all those who give toward paper, and we will continue to be as frugal as possible with all the funds that are given.



Five years ago my wife Diane, who is a nurse, traveled to Hatgal, Mongolia, on a medical mission trip with *Beacon of Hope Medical Missions* (*BOHMM*). She fell in love with the people and country, so the next time *BOHMM* went to Mongolia I went along to carry her bags. A year later we returned to Mongolia with my friend Dave Edester and his wife Becky. Of all the places to go to in the world, Mongolia was not on the list of places I wanted to visit, but our plans are not always God's plan. Mongolia itself is often considered a third-world country by



American standards. While the capital city is modern, you do not have to drive very far out of the city center before running water and indoor toilets become the exception and not the norm. This is a country where the temperature often drops to -40° in the winter. It is a country where many people still herd sheep and live in tents called *gers*. But it is just like all countries, in that it needs the Word of God.

There is a well-established print shop in the capitol city, Ulan Bator, run by missionary Jeff Kruchkow. Jeff and his crew are instrumental in printing much of the material currently being used in Mongolia. Getting to Ulan Bator from the States takes about a day and a half by plane. Flights between Ulan Bator and Hatgal are only available during the summer, so Bro. Kruchkow drove us 400 miles across the country, which took two days of driving. After reaching Hatgal, Dave, who is an electric technician, was able to sort out many of the issues that were affecting the machinery in the print shop there. We were then able to print some Sunday school material.

The missionaries in Hatgal are Mickey and Trina Cofer, who have been there since 2007. Their focus is on church planting, leadership training, and Gospel printing. They also host summer camp for city children and train Mongolians in different job skills to help them help themselves. I was excited to see their printing ministry. The Cofers plan to spread the Gospel by printing Bibles, New Testaments and Sunday School materials. An important aspect of the print shop's location in Hatgal is its proximity to neighboring countries. Russia and China border Mongolia, and all the "stan" countries, such as Afghanistan, are nearby. This location and people have access to many places Americans cannot enter.

An important reason to print in country is the cost. While Bearing Precious Seed could print for Mongolia at a cheaper cost, the custom duty charged is almost \$1 per John & Romans. This makes it cost prohibitive to get Scripture into the country. Only through the intervention of God were we recently able to get 200,000 Mongolian books of Mark in at a reasonable cost. However, the government officials who allowed that are no longer in power. These things make printing in country very important, not to mention that local Mongolian churches should be involved in getting God's Word to their own people.

Pray for the Cofers and the great fruit that this work could produce.

Right now there is no one to run the printing press in Hatgal. Pray for God to provide a man who could not only go run the press, but could also train men there to print the Word of God for that area of the world.
